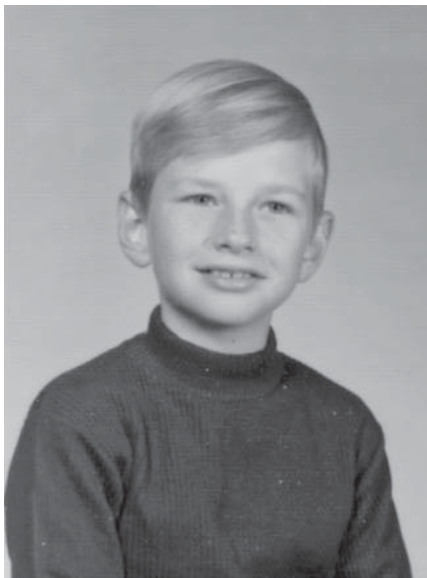

I remember how long and boring the ride seemed at times, especially since I had no little brother or sister to argue and fight with along the way. No matter what time of the day or night we would arrive, Grandma Hartley was waiting up for us. She was a very loving and caring person and seemed to be liked by everyone who knew her. I will always be reminded of the flower beds which surrounded Grandma's house. Her flowers attracted dozens of hummingbirds, and I was determined to catch one and bring it back to Wichita for my friends to see. I would spend countless hours chasing hummingbirds around her house .

When I finally gave up, Grandma would always let out a laugh and ask me how many I had caught that day. My response was always the same. She must have felt sorry for me, because she would pull out her coin purse and count out enough change for me to go down the street for an ice cream cone.

Needless to say, my friends never saw one of Grandma's hummingbirds. During many of our trips to Ava my father would take us to Grandma's old farm. I always enjoyed my father's stories about growing up during the depression and how hard it was to make ends meet. Aunt Kiree, who was my father's oldest sister lived just a few blocks from Grandma. Aunt Kiree was a very gentle and kind person and I always looked forward to her picnic lunches alongside the creek just outside of Ava. To this day I don't believe I have had a tuna sandwich that would top Aunt



Kiree's.

My father and mother were very family oriented and gatherings with aunts, uncles, and cousins were common. Uncle William (Lawrence) was my father's older brother and he lived on a farm with his wife, Aunt Mina and their children. I looked forward to the visits to their house and always managed to find some mischief to get into with my cousins (Richard, Barbara, and Steve).

There was never a dull moment. Uncle Lawrence was quite the prankster and pinned me with the nickname "Dino", which stuck with me for years. My mother and Aunt Mina were very close and provided each other with much support and encouragement during rough times. I can remember my mother referring to Aunt Mina as her sister on a number of occasions.

We were also close to my father's younger sister, Aunt Dochia (Levon) and her family. My Aunt Levon was always a very positive and fun person to be around and I still look forward to our visits. Her children, Sue and Joe, were always a big part of our life, and we shared many a family dinner together. Sue and Joe were close in age to my older brothers and I enjoyed listening to their stories about growing up. Sue, her husband Larry Masters, and their children Larry Jr., Terry, and Tameria (Tammy) lived near us in Wichita. Larry Jr, Terry, Tammy and I were close in age and had a lot of great times riding motorcycles or playing ball together. My mother considered Sue the daughter she never had, and they talked nearly every day. I know it was very comforting to my mother in her later years to have someone like Sue to confide in.

The family bonds and memories I have from my childhood are special to me, and I feel they are a big part of who I am today. Times were not always easy, but we all managed to make the best of them.

After High School

My parents always encouraged us to participate in sports, so athletics were a big part of my life as a child.. After graduation, a friend introduced me to technical rock and ice climbing, which became a passion for me. When work and school permitted I was off to Colorado to pursue my new interest..
