Seems like we spent our last dime making a phone call looking for someone to pick us up, and that didn't work. So we set out and had to walk all the way back to Joe's house in northwest Wichita. When we got back, we were a whipped bunch.}

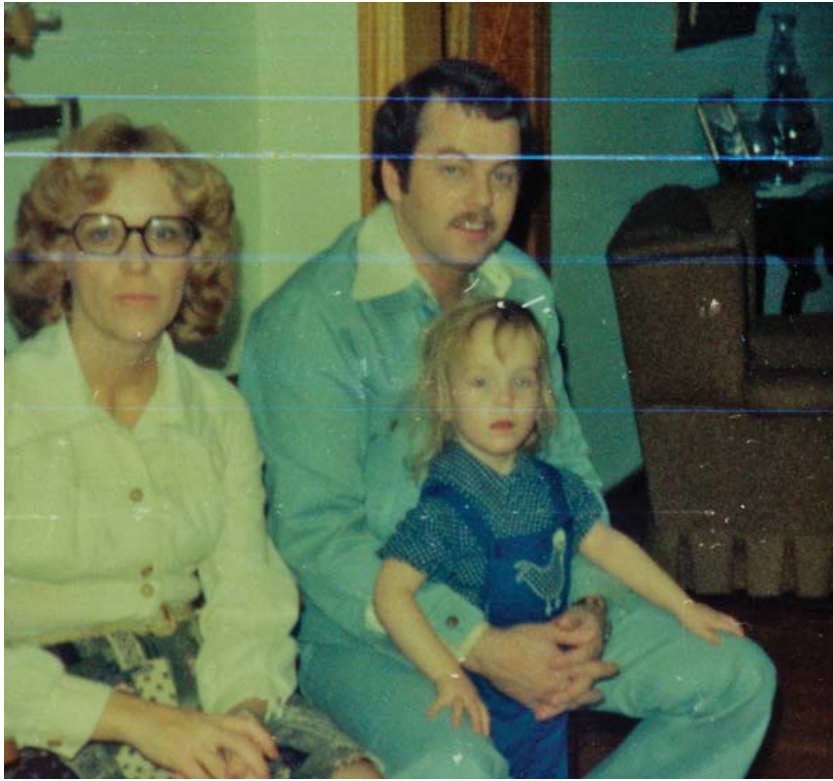
Eventually, Joe's parents moved to a house just south of Wichita State University. Joe remembers all the good times to be had hanging around that campus. Seems like one of his friends was the University President's son, and they had the run of the place. He remembers that place fondly.

Like a lot of his cousins, Joe's ticket out of Wichita was the U.S. Navy. After that, Joe spent many years in sales—cars, furniture, and modular homes, mostly. Then he followed that up with many years as a cross-country semi truck driver.

How did Joe meet his soul mate? Well, according to Joe, he was selling cars in Kansas City, and a pretty young lady lived across the street from him.

Joe and Robbie were married on October 18, 1968, in Miami, OK, before returning to Kansas City to start their new life together. Their joy was cut short the following year when their first-born, William Joe, had serious health issues and lived less than a week. The little guy was buried in Kansas City.

At some point, Joe and Robbie relocated to Dallas, Texas, where Joe continued his sales career. It was in Dallas where their daughters were born:

- Melissa Joy Luttrell on August 30, 1971
- Teresa Ann Luttrell on June 16, 1972

When the girls were young, Joe and Robbie moved to northwest Arkansas where Joe's mother was living. Joe was in sales for many years but eventually turned to a long career as an over-the-road trucker. Robbie went to work at the WalMart headquarters in nearby Bentonville, AR, where she still works.

Major tragedy hit Joe and Robbie's family June 25, 1994, when Teresa was killed in an auto accident in Springdale, AR. She had celebrated her 22nd birthday just a week earlier. Just as she was starting her adult life, it was snuffed out. Joe and Robbie carried on but without a doubt never got over it.

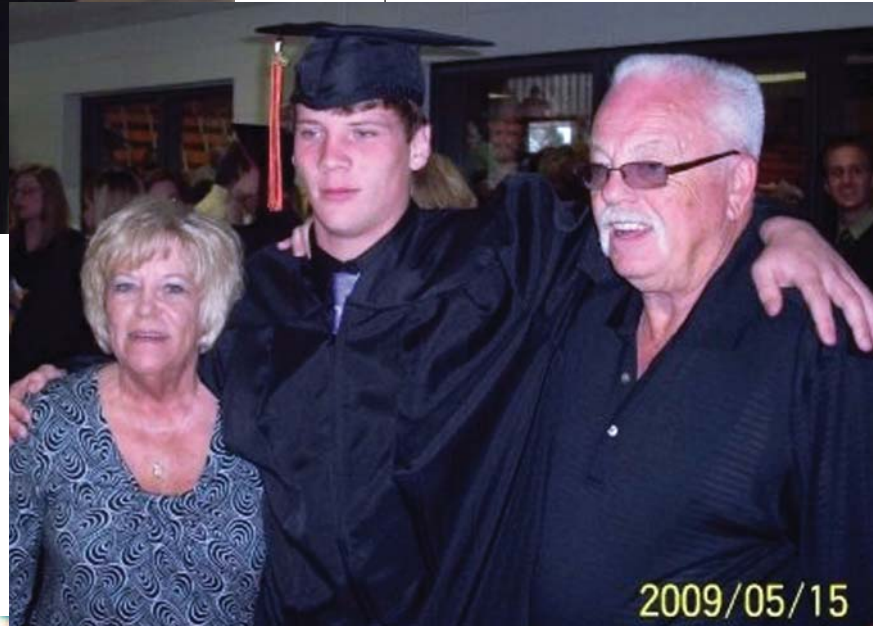
